David) to talk about his way of healing through a psychosocial approach and to shed light on the importance and ongoing issues relating to human rights. With the International Human Rights Day coming up on the 10th of December, we feel it is even more important to highlight the issue, which we will document and share online. Alex has experienced political violence while trying to exercise his rights as an activist in his home country, Honduras, where he used to work with our partner organization - Centro de Prevención, Tratamiento y Rehabilitación de las Víctimas de la Tortura y sus familiares (CPTRT). He had to flee due to attacks and death threats and is now living in exile in Spain, where he works with emigrants. Alex has a psychosocial approach that includes individual testimonies. He has used it in individual and collective healing.

Before Alex's talk, we will listen to Protestorkesteret. It is a Danish band that has specialized in playing Danish, Latin-American, and other famous international protest songs from the 1960s to the 1980s. Many of the lyrics are more relevant today than they were when they were written.



Take away, the Columbian musician and singer and musician Mambe will play the traditional Columbian rhythm Cumbria, which is for everyone to dance to. Often the lyrics have political twists and criticize the injustices in society.

In Ecuador the second phase of our project "Enhancing the Prevention of Gender-based violence in Ecuador" is well under way. The project must adjust to a new and much more violent context in the country, where even presidential candidates are killed or threatened by organized crime related to the drug trade. This has a growing, negative impact on the political systems in an increasing number of countries in the region.

Development with partners in the Global South

We currently have three ongoing projects.

In Sri Lanka we initiated the second phase of our partnership with Rule of Law. The project title is: "Advocacy to Contribute to the Sri Lankan Civil Movement on Resisting Corruption (CMRC)". It aims to provide much needed capacity-building support to CSOs, civil actors, and local communities to understand the serious interconnection between the failure of rule of law and rampant corruption at all levels, as a way of addressing the corruption problems that impede the development of the country.




Very recently funding was approved for the fourth phase of our project in Honduras: "Strengthening Political Advocacy and Psychosocial Support to Networks of Young Human Rights Defenders in Choluteca, Honduras".





Additionally, we have submitted two more project proposals and are awaiting response from CISU for projects in Zimbabwe and the Philippines, both in extension of our previous projects and partnerships. We notice that there is a growing competition for funds from CISU. That puts pressure on us to submit proposals of still higher quality.





In October 2023, we had a visit of Malu Cagay from our Philippine partner organization, Center for Disaster Preparedness (CDP).





BEVENTS





Throughout 2023, Nunca Más participated in several events. On Wednesday, April 19 we participated in an event in memory of the 5th anniversary of the citizen protests in Nicaragua. We organized the event as members of the Danish Nicaraguan Network (International Børnesolidaritet, Mellemamerika Komiteen, Verdens Skove and the Nicaragua Group of The Red-Green Alliance) in Folkets Hus, Copenhagen.

On April 24, we again celebrated Mother Earth Day, Pachamama, organized by ILAS (Iberian and Latin American Studies Forum) and CApE (Center for Applied Ecological Thinking) at the University of Copenhagen in collaboration with Academia Intercultural - Det Interkulturelle Akademi (AllA) and Sonamos Latino americano. The event included a film screening about a female Peruvian shaman Madre Irene, a traditional ceremony by Laura Ponce-Gartmann, and a Scientific Seminar organized by ILAS (Iberian and Latin American Studies Forum).





On Saturday, May 27 we took part in the Latin America Day at Nørrebro, where many people of all ages passed by the Nunca Mas stand and heard about the organization.





On Wednesday, June 21 Nunca Más coorganized a premier of a Nicaraguan documentary on the political situation four years after the huge manifestations against the regime of the President Daniel Ortega and his wife, the Vice-President Rosario Murillo in Cinemateket. The premier was followed by a debate with other grassroot organizations from the Danish Nicaragua Network as well as CINEMATEKET and Casa Latinoamericana. More than 100 people participated.



Internal stuff

In April we said hello to our new Student Assistant Carla Grahl, who spends most of her time helping Anne Marie with financial controlling. At the same time, we also moved our office from the old historic building in Dronningensgade at Christianshavn to Foreningshuset, Sundholm 8 at Sundby Amager. Here we have a modern office in another historic building – although this building is only 100 years old, but much warmer and with many activities and possibilities for networking. It provides a good space for the further development of the association and for activities. Here our annual general assembly took place, and we welcomed a couple of new members.



In August the board and volunteers met up for a strategy workshop to discuss the future direction of the association. We discussed whether we should opt for becoming a programme organization at CISU, whether we shall have more and larger projects, whether we need more members, and what relationship should be between hired (part time) staff and volunteers. We also discussed the psychosocial approach, our present organizational goals and may other topics.







Our human rights ambassador Jorge Alberto Laínez has been named honorable ambassador by the Ministry of Education for his invaluable artistic career in favour of the promotion and Máprotection of the environment, culture, and the protection of human rights.

Alberto is a Honduran singer-songwriter and has collaborated with Nunca Más on our projects with the Honduran indigenous group known as the Lencas. The Lencas add great emotional, cultural, and spiritual significance to music, making the addition of Alberto and his musicality to our communication with the Lencas a quintessential aspect of supporting them in an impactful, culturally sensitive, and significant manner.
